Safe at Home for the Holidays

Taking a walk through our office, it is obvious things have NOT returned to normal. Today we counted 127 current emergency assistance requests from our neighbors in need - requests for funding to assist with preventing evictions and utility terminations, as well as, help starting over with first month's rent and utility deposits! Yes, 127 households that we are currently working with to keep families together and safe at home! And that is just for this week. COVID-19 continues to affect so many households with active cases, family spread, as well as quarantining to prevent spread. With prices increasing for groceries, heating and gasoline, times are tough and people are having problems paying their bills. And, with colder temperatures and higher heating bills, this is just the beginning.

Some examples incude:

Mary and her children have COVID-19 and have been home for a month without income and not recovering quickly. Eric was in a car wreck and lost his car and also was injured and is unable to pay his bill. Tracy's expenses have increased so much lately, especially for gasoline, she does not have the money for her utility bill. Sally lives on a fixed income for Social Security and with the rising prices and costs of fuel, she is unable to purchase heating fuel for her home. Steve had surgery and is out of work without pay and unable to pay his bill. Lucy has had to quarantine twice lately due to COVID exposures and has bills without income.

These are just a few stories of the many families in need of our assistance. We have the system in place to help but need funds to be able to continue to offer hope and financial resources to our many neighbors in need.








Sophia had been without a home and when moving into her new place needed furniture. IOA provided her with beds, a kitchen table and chairs, dressers, and living room furniture, turning her house into a home!

We also gave bus passes and helped with id's for Terry, Ray, and Steve so they could start their new jobs and secure their own place to stay. People also received rides or bus tickets home to supportive family and jobs. All of this in addition to our many life skills classes shared in the Lynchburg and Amherst jails as well as the Lynchburg Juvenile Detention Center so people can be successful when they return home!
